Many changes characterized the 2019 AAOS Fine Art, Photography and 3-D show. For the first time, we handled the applications online through the CaFe site, a professional web site for artists and art organizations. This made the application process a lot more efficient, saving the committee members considerable time and energy. The money was directed into the AAOS bank account directly, easing that part of the process as well.

Of the more than 200 entries, the jury whittled the entries down to ....

Partnering with the Sand and Sawdust Festival meant that we needed to move into June. The board members felt that by doing this, the show would get more attention from the public, as the Sand and Sawdust Festival draws large crowds.

During the show, AAOS board members received quite a bit of feedback from members. Some complained about the later date, some did not like having to sign up via the internet. Others felt that the smaller show took away from the opportunity of local artists to exhibit their work.

On their part, the board members pointed to the fact

that of about 100 AAOS members, only about 10 were actively helping put the show

together. Also, our members are not all that spry, most of us being well over 65 years old. The large shows of the past were becoming harder and harder to handle by the faithful volunteers.

Board members also point out that, by partnering with Sand and Sawdust, AAOS gets a lot of free advertising, and free use of the space we formerly had to pay thousands of dollars to use.

The board will carefully consider the feedback and look at ways to remedy what is possible to change for the better. the board members invite you to attend the monthly meeting to give your input and become an active participant.


# We are still accepting donations.
